Polar travel information will also be introduced, including winter activities like ice fishing, snow mobile and dog sledding. Learn how to capture the exciting lights on camera from Astrolink's experts; they will teach the essentials in astrophotography - equipments, filming locations, celestial targets and post-processing techniques.

With the well-developed high-speed rail network on the mainland, Sunny Wong, the travel agent turned KOL, will share tips on mobile-ticketing for short and long rail trips, while adventure-seekers will be thrilled by Travel Chung's talk on Afghanistan and the China-Pakistan Highway.

For more, visit the numerous prefectures featured in the Japan pavilion - Saitama, Hyogo, Nagasaki, Niigata, Yamagata and Kagawa, along with regions of San'in and Kita-Kanto, and take photos with the adorable mascots stationed there.
